William Henry Studio

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Matt Conable founded William Henry Knives in 1997. In the 14 years since, the original knife company has grown into the William Henry Studio, producing fine cutlery, writing instruments and money clips with new products of commensurate stature still in the development stage. Conable's philosophy has never wavered in the 14 years since the company's founding. "A tool that's crafted by hand and works superlatively is really art in and of itself. A tool that came off a big machine can be very good, but it doesn't have any warmth—there's no soul to it," he says. "What continues to intrigue me is that you can dually develop an improved tool and measure increasingly high levels of performance, and you

can also figure out how to make it beautiful so that it stands equally in a museum or out in the field ..."

The William Henry Studio collection incorporates the kinds of materials that are as much about scarcity and story as they are about beauty and brawn. Mokume gane, custom-forged Damascus, aerospace-grade titanium, exotic woods and fossil materials, as well as the finest traditional materials—like ebonite—are intertwined in remarkable combinations. The studio produces only limited edition pieces in both fountain (18-karat nib only) and rollerball versions. Sterling silver, gold, gemstones and other jewelry-grade adornments provide the finishing touches. The limited edition pens are available through William Henry authorized dealers, with prices starting at \$650.

William Henry pocket knives have gained a worldwide reputation for excellence—in fact, they stand alone as the brand and product that define luxury in pocket knives. In the past two years, the studio has translated that passion for tools, rare materials and fine craftsmanship into a stunning range of writing instruments that expand the range of functional art that William Henry offers. "More than anything, we come from a tradition of craft excellence, and that's consistent in everything we do," says Conable. "The vision of this company was to build—and these are our exact words from ten years ago—'the finest tools possible.' That was it, and that's never changed." All William Henry pens, knives and money clips are handcrafted in the company's own studio in the heart of Oregon's wine country.
